HSE regulations now include improved guidance of the first aid supplies and equipment that are required in the workplace. Employers must provide adequate and appropriate equipment, facilities and personnel to ensure their employees receive immediate attention if they are injured or taken ill at work. Before selecting your workplace's first aid equipment and supplies you must consider the size of your workplace and the number of employees in each area.

Do I need a first aid kit for my workplace?

The Health and Safety Executive (HSE) advise that all workplaces have a first aid kit. The contents should be based on your first aid needs assessment, there is no mandatory list of items.

In 2019/20, there were 693,000 non-fatal injuries in UK workplaces, having a first aid kit and first aider on hand can help reduce absence lengths of staff after an injury.

The HSE advise as a minimum that your first aid kit could contain:

- first aid guidance leaflet
- individually wrapped sterile plasters
- sterile eye pads
- triangular bandages
- resuscitation face shield
- HSE dressing large & medium
- disposable gloves
- burns dressing





How often do I need to replace the items in my first aid kit?

You should be replacing items in your first aid kit as you use them to ensure you always have a supply of all necessary items. First Aid Kits for the workplace

British Standard compliant first aid kits reflect the most up-to-date changes in both workplace practice and risks, making them demonstrably more 'fit for purpose' in today's environment. The quantities and sizes of first aid kits to be used in a workplace environment should be determined by the number of people on site and the category of hazard they are exposed to.

The following information categorises workplaces by level of risk, and then recommends an appropriate size of kit, depending on the number of employees and members of the public exposed to those risks.

I. DO A RISK ASSESSMENT. LOW RISK: (e.g. shops, offices, libraries etc.) HIGH RISK: (e.g. light engineering and assembly work, food processing, warehousing, etc.)

2. DECIDE ON THE SIZE AND QUANTITY OF KITS REQUIRED TO MEET YOUR RISK NEEDS ASSESSMENT.

- · SMALL KIT USAGE GUIDELINES LOW RISK: I kit for less than 25 employees HIGH RISK: I kit for less than 5 employees
- MEDIUM KIT USAGE GUIDELINES LOW RISK: 1 kit per 25-100 employees HIGH RISK: 1 kit per 5-25 employees
- · LARGE KIT USAGE GUIDELINES LOW RISK: 1 kit per 100 employees HIGH RISK: 1 kit per 25 employees
- TRAVEL AND MOTORING Staff working remotely from a company vehicle should be equipped with a travel and motoring first aid kit. This does not supersede BS8599-2 for vehicle first aid kits, employers should refer to BS8599-2 when equipping vehicles with first aid kits.

The British Standard BS8599 - I

The BS8599-1:2019 Guidelines have been updated and now include recommendations on supplementary kits as an extra resource to British Standard Compliant Small, Medium, Large and Travel & Motoring First Aid Kits.

PERSONAL ISSUE FIRST AID KIT

Containing basic first aid components for one person. e.g. maintenance, security personnel, cleaners, first aiders, etc.

CRITICAL INJURY PACK

Designed for environments where people could sustain a severe injury. Contains items to help manage catastrophic blood loss. e.g. work with dangerous machinery or sharp instruments, cutting equipment, power tools, construction, agriculture, forestry, etc.



What is each item in my first aid kit used for?

Below we have listed the most common items that you will come across within your first aid kit and what they should be used for. All these items can be purchased individually from our online supplies store.

Sterile Dressings



- Wound Dressings A sterile wounds dressing will usually consist of a dressing pad that is attached to a roller bandage. These are used for larger wounds such as an abrasion or a stab wound.
- Adhesive Dressings (plasters) Adhesive dressings are applied to small cuts or grazes and are made of fabric or waterproof plastic. Those who work with food are required to use blue plasters. Hypoallergenic plasters can also be used for anyone who is allergic to plaster adhesive.



Bandages



- **Triangular bandages -** Triangular bandages are made of cloth and can be used to create a bandage or a sling.
- Crepe bandages BP grade cotton, Strong weave, and high elasticity.
 Outstanding stretch, easy to wear.
 Excellent for support, sprains strains and minor aches



Gloves and face shield

- **Disposable gloves** You should wear gloves, if available, when you are dealing with wounds, bleeding, any bodily fluids or waste materials.
- · CPR masks and face shields
 - A plastic face shield can be used to protect you and the casualty from cross infection when giving rescue breaths.





Other items

- Cleansing wipes used to clean skin around wounds.
- **Gauze pads** these pads can be used as a dressing, padding or to clean around a wound.
- Adhesive tape use this to secure dressings and bandages.
- **Scissors** these should be blunt ended so as not to cause injuries and can be used to cut bandages.
- **Pins or clips** use these to secure the end of a bandage.
