Primary pupils to be taught first aid

FIRST aid will now be taught in primary schools across Scotland after a long-fought campaign.

Teachers will be able to access free online plans to help equip kids from P1 to P7 with potentially life-saving skills.

Jenny Gilruth said: "No one expects to deal with an emergency, but first aid can be crucial in supporting the response

to one."

The course was piloted in partnership with Stirling Council in 2021.

Since then, the charity has trained 56 teachers from 31 of the city's 40 primary schools.
